Parking



Mandarin Lessons

Our Mandarin lessons have once again recommenced this year for pupils in Yrs 1-7. Our tutor this year is Ms Qimeng Xia (Shirley). Through this programme pupils will be introduced to the language and culture of China and will learn simple phrases such as greetings and numbers.

Music Tuition

Our strings tuition, provided by the EA Music Service, has recommenced again for this year. Ms McGeough provides these lessons on Wednesday afternoons. Our drumming and piping tuition, funded by the Ulster Scots Agency has also recommenced on Mondays and Tuesdays. Mr Ian Matchett is our drumming tutor while Mr Ivor Laird is our piping tutor. AMMA Partnership Programme

Our school is part of a local cluster of schools that has been accepted onto the AMMA Partnership Programme this year. Throughout the year, staff will receive training in the area of Games Based Learning and will receive support in the planning and delivery of lessons in class.

Shared Education

Our school will be continuing our Shared Education Partnership with St. Oliver Plunkett PS & NU, Beragh. Funding from Fermanagh and Omagh District Council and the Department of Education has been received to help support these activities. Activities will include trips, for some pupils, to the Ulster American Folk Park, Enniskillen Castle, Pomeroy Forest and Gortin Glen Forest. Years 1, 3 and 7 will participate in shared lessons, the focus of which will be learning outdoors and ICT.

Ulster-Scots Leid Week

Our PTA have been successful in securing funding to help support activities during Ulster-Scots Leid Week, which will be held 24th—28th November. Ceilidh dancing sessions will be held on Wednesday 26th November while Lambeg drumming sessions will be held on Friday 28th November. These sessions will be for our Primary School pupils and parents will be welcome to attend. Further details will follow closer to the time.
